John Cagney - Potential International Project

John Cagney's perception of Bali was as the ultimate party place. A view formed mainly from media images of Kuta Beach and the experiences of younger members of his family.

However to broaden his perception, he and wife Nicola headed for the hinterland to discover the real Bali and search for the headquarters of the KUPU KUPU Foundation, where Nicola's mum Geraldine had worked as a volunteer teacher a few years earlier.

KUPU KUPU is Indonesian for Butterfly and is a place where people born with disabilities are given the opportunity to make and sell artefacts to earn a little income. In Indonesian

culture a disability is regarded as a sign that a person must have done something wrong in a previous life and this is their penalty. Consequently those affected are culturally excluded, receive no financial support and are generally ignored by society. KUPU KUPU is a place where these unfortunates can turn into 'butterflies' are receive an opportunity to break free of their cocoon. The organisation operates without any government funding and is supported solely by donations and people who volunteer their help for short periods.

Whist not promoting this specifically as a project for the Club, John said that the visit did help him focus on what how fortunate we in Australia are and what service is all about.
