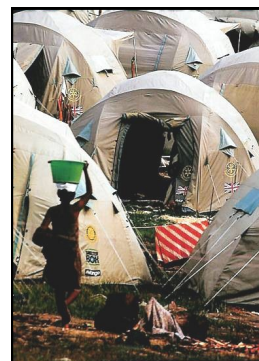
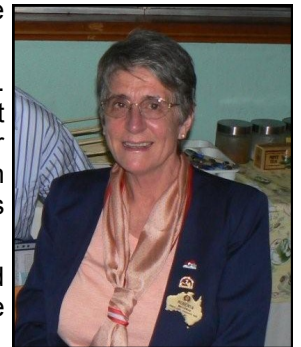
*District Governor Roberta Waterman*

Roberta's role as a District Governor is to deliver Rotary International President D.K. Lee's message to 'Make Dreams Real' through the Rotary Foundation.

The Rotary Foundation is Rotary's beating heart. Through it, all of Rotary's humanitarian projects to assist with basic human needs such as safe and reliable water supply, and literacy, are delivered. It also funds Youth Exchange and programs to promote peace such as Ambassadorial Scholars and Peace Scholars.

The world-wide campaign to eradicate Polio is organised and funded through the Rotary Foundation, but there are many other programs.

Shelterbox is a project which helps in meeting emergency shelter and one to which primary school students in SA have contributed to through their local Rotary Club. Gold coin donations are accepted until they reach \$1,200, which is enough to purchase a Shelterbox.



Other subjects DG Roberta covered were the environment, water conservation and storm water management. In this regard, Roberta encouraged us to continue to plant trees and work toward involving ourselves in the wetlands project.
