**GUEST SPEAKER**

***Hans Henning-Mundell & Bev Mundel - Atherstone***  
***An autobiographical, Career & Rotary Overview.***

Henning has a background (and a PHD) in Agriculture (specialising in beans) and is in Australia to address an agricultural conference in Wagga.

Henning first met John Holds as a CUSO Volunteer in India 42 years ago and they have remained friends ever since. At the time, Henning was working to establish a safflower project for the Paniya colony in southern India. Since then, Henning and Bev have undertaken many humanitarian projects on behalf of Rotary and other organisations, in India, Pakistan and Kenya.

Although they have worked on many projects together, Bev is also professionally qualified, recently attaining a PHD in psychology.

Now based in Lethbridge, Alberta (CAN) and recently retired, Henning and Bev are working to raise \$50,000 to establish a hospital in southern India for the Paniya colony. The colony is isolated and has remained in desperate need for over 40 years.

There is no doubt that Bev and Henning have lived a life, and we thank them for sharing some of that extraordinary life with us tonight.
