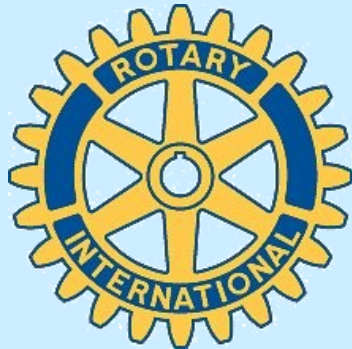

Maureen gave us a brief overview of the activities of the Waikerie Club in District 9520. Waikerie has a population of approx 5,000 if the surrounding area is included.

The club has 37 members and its main source of income is an Op-Shop which raises some \$55,000 per annum. It is staffed by volunteers and supported by Rotarians two days per week. Other activities include a Food fair and Camp Oven Dinner.

GUEST SPEAKER

Monica Fernandez - Orana Respite Care

Monica is the manager of the Orana Respite Service and gave us an insight into its operations and the challenges she faces in managing the limited resources available.

Orana provides care facilities for people with disabilities so that their carers can have periodic respite or time to attend to their own appointments or needs.

Orana provides a range of services and operates a number of facilities for people with disabilities across SA.

In Whyalla and the Eyre Peninsula, there are 52 clients who utilise the service and the hours of the staff are fully utilised in the respite caring process.

They are presently investigating the possibility of building a purpose home widen their respite opportunities.
