Rotary Information - Rotary Fellowships

AG Tim brought to our attention the fact that June is Rotary Fellowships Month. In this months Rotary Down Under there is an article detailing some of the Fellowships available within Rotary. For instance, there is a fellowship which has been formed for the purpose of tracking mountain gorilla's; or what about Pre-Columbian Civilizations, or Carnivals, Parades and Festivals as well as the more recognisable, Antique Automobiles, Cricket, or Scuba Diving.

The one which took our interest was Magna Graecia. **Magna Graecia** is latin for "Great Greece" and is the name of the coastal areas of Southern Italy on the Tarentine Gulf which was extensively colonized by Greek settlers.¹ The colonists, who began arriving in the 8th century BC, brought with them their Hellenic civilization, which was to leave a lasting imprint in Italy, particularly on the culture of ancient Rome.

This fellowship aims to bring together Rotarians keen on history, heritage and archaeology who are particularly interested in the area of *Magna Graecia*. Presumably this Rotary fellowship likes to meet at the Hotel Magna Graecia in this picturesque area of the world on a regular basis.
