CLIMBING MT. KILIMANJARO

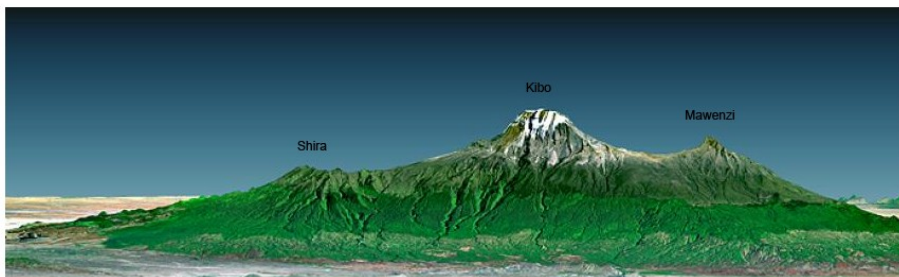

CLUB ASSEMBLY & VISIONING

Facilitator: John Davis.

Formalities were dispensed with as we gathered to set some priorities and assess our strengths and weaknesses following the Club Visioning process we undertook a few weeks ago.

When we considered our **strengths**, we came up with these.

- We enjoy being together; the banter and camaraderie amongst mutual respect for each other.
- There is a mix of traditional Rotary values with a strong desire to be involved in community.
- We have strong leaders who liaise well with the membership.
- We have a 'can do' attitude.
- We are generous with our time.
- There is a genuine desire to make a difference.
- We have good physical assets eg MCU, Pavilion.

On the other hand, a few **weaknesses** appeared.

- A lot of the work is done by just a few.
- We need to retain and diversify our expertise.
- Some projects are offered but not taken up.
- There has been a lack of significant community projects.
- Not a lot of guests turn into members.

During course of the discussion which followed the following conclusions were formed.

- ▶ Members enjoy the camaraderie but get excited by projects. A flagship project that inspires the community is necessary.
- ▶ Our expertise in is facilitation rather than execution.
- ▶ The Club needs a consistent program so that members know when to bring guests.
- ▶ We need to recognise the difference between fundraising activities and a community project. As an example, although our MCU provides community exposure, the activity is a fundraising measure for the community project we intend to undertake later. It is the Project which gains the attention and respect of the community.
- ▶ We need to be conscious of the product we are selling. What is it that makes us who we are and do we offer value for money?

PRESIDENT-ELECT JANE.

Jane has obviously been paying attention, because she has a plan, and it goes like this. Yes, we need to find that project, but so that members can bring guests and be involved in the club program, the monthly meeting structure will change to this...

1st & 2nd Weeks: The Program Director will organise guest speakers for these meetings. There will be Club History on the first meeting, but no general reports although significant information will be provided in the Presidents Opening Remarks.

3rd Week: The opportunity for members to nominate a guest speaker or speak themselves. Please keep Program Director John Davis informed so that it fits into the program and so that members can be kept informed through the Bulletin and Website.

4th Week. Rotary Information and Fun. This meeting will include the Secretary's Report, Treasurers report, Public Relations and Community Projects reports.

5th Week. On occasions where there are five Tuesdays in a month, a Club Assembly will be held that month. Usually four per year.
