Arafura Resources derives its name from the Arafura Sea, the body of water between the Northern Territory & New Guinea. Arafura sea comes from the Portuguese "mare aurifera" meaning "sea of gold" & dates back to 1623.

After many years of acquiring sizeable land holdings in geologically prospective areas with known mineralisation since its formation in 1997 Arafura emerged as a prominent Junior Miner after listing on the ASX in 2003 with sights set firmly on brining its world class Nolans Project into production in the near future. Critical to this development & success is a Rare Earths Treatment Plant currently being planned for a site just north of Whyalla.

Arafura's Vision is to become one of the leading Rare Earth producing companies in the world.

About Rare Earths:

Rare earths are essential to products with significant growth potential in markets associated with the electronics & technology industries, energy efficiency & greenhouse gas reduction. As a key component in re-chargable batteries & the magnets in electric motors, rare earths play a fundamental role in hybrid motor vehicles. The diverse nuclear, chemical, metallurgical, catalytic, magnetic & optical properties of the Rare Earth Elements (REE) have led to an ever increasing variety of applications & demands. REE are critical & strategic components in many hi-tech developments—especially relevant for mobile phones, personal organisers, laptop computers & LCD television screens.

Allan mentioned 15 of the most significant rare earth element. I urge you all to visit the Arafura website for a detailed description of their use & appearance etc.

Tim proposed a vote of thanks to Allan for his commitment to this project which is vital to Whyalla's future.
