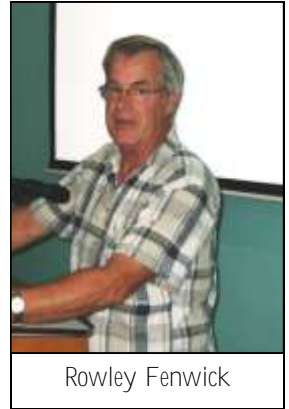

## GUEST SPEAKER

### Rob Walton - Mullaquana Port Option

Rob presented an alternative to the Point Lowly Port option presently in favour with the Government for the export of minerals etc from this region. This presentation prepared by John Scott and a group of engineers offers Mullaquana as a more logical and viable solution.

Presently there are 9 mines operating on Eyre Peninsula and the Gawler Craton, however by 2015 there are expected to be 23 and by 2020, 40. The need for a deep water export facility is self evident. The aims of this group are to support industry, recognise the need for a deep water port and to keep Pt. Lowly as a peaceful environment for the benefit of Whyalla as a tourist and recreational drawcard. The group believes that with this option, we can achieve all of these.

Rob presented a compelling argument for Mullaquana as the preferred option and approached the argument from a logical and economic perspective which was well received by those present.

We encouraged Rob to ensure that the decision makers and stakeholders in the decision process attend a similar presentations as we are sure that they cannot help but be persuaded. Rob encouraged us to make our opinions known to Council and WEDB.
